In storing the home canned product, homemakers are urged to store them in a cool place as temperatures cause the food to lose much of its nutrient value.

**HOW ABOUT** a \$100 cake recipe? This is the Wheat League chocolate cake winner at the Morrow county fair here last week entered by Mrs. Floyd (Lorena) Jones.  
 1/2 cup butter  
 2 cups sugar  
 3 squares chocolate  
 1 1/2 cups sweet milk  
 2 eggs  
 2 cups cake flour  
 2 tsp. baking powder  
 2 tsp. vanilla  
 1/2 tsp. salt  
 dash of cinnamon (optional)  
 1 cup walnuts (optional)  
 Cream butter with sugar, add eggs, one at a time, beating well; add melted chocolate, vanilla and flour mixture of dry ingredients alternately with the milk. Bake in two deep 9" pans for 30 minutes in 350 degree oven. Frost as desired. Good luck, Lorena, at the bake-off in Portland this winter!
