Mr. and Mrs. Louis Lorengel and family were in The Dalles Sunday to visit friends and to have medical care.

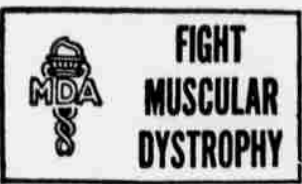
Mr. and Mrs. Guy Williams were business visitors to Prineville Saturday.

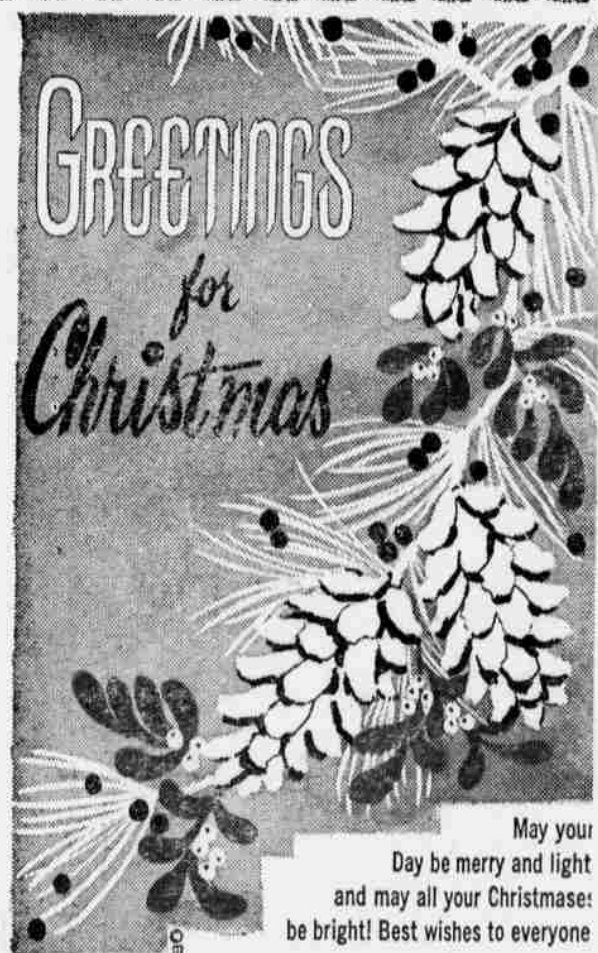

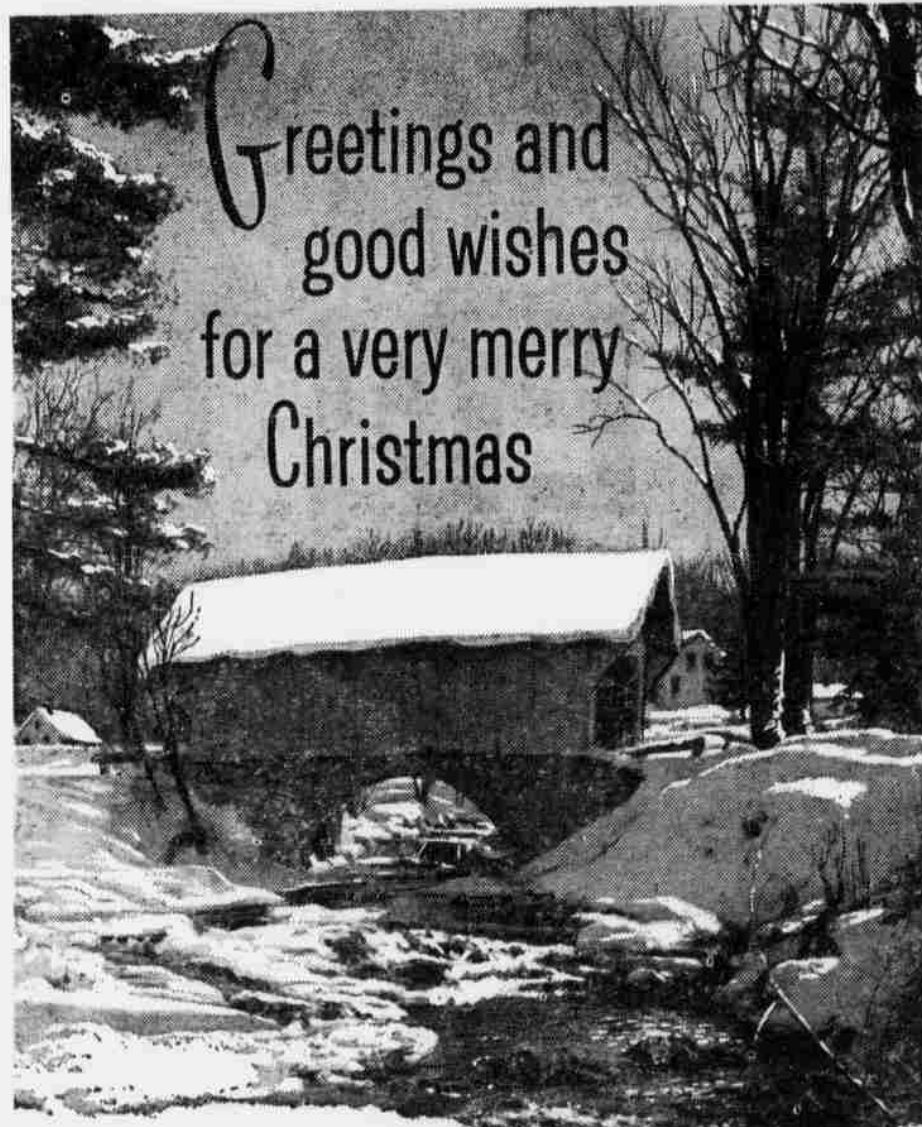
