Irrigon Council Discuss Proposed Water System

IRRIGON—At the December city council meeting, the Council accepted a feasibility report on a city water system. Mayor Chester Wilson was appointed as the city's representative in bringing the program to its completion.

After Christmas, informative letters will be mailed to property owners in Irrigon, explaining the proposed system, and the approximate cost. These letters will be followed by a public meeting which will be held for the purpose of answering questions that may be raised. Plans are for the engineering representatives to be present at this meeting to assist the council in answering questions. Archie French of the Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield Engineering firm is working with the city of Irrigon on this project.

Crossing To Be Opened

An agreement has been signed between the city of Irrigon and the Union Pacific Railroad for clearing the legal details that have delayed the opening of the 6th street crossing. Authorization to proceed with the construction of the crossing is expected to follow shortly.

Verbal appreciation was voiced for the men who have donated time and labor to clean up the lots adjoining the railroad track. Appreciation was expressed to Ernest Stephens, Leon Bentley and Mayor Chester Wilson for their efforts in improving these lots.

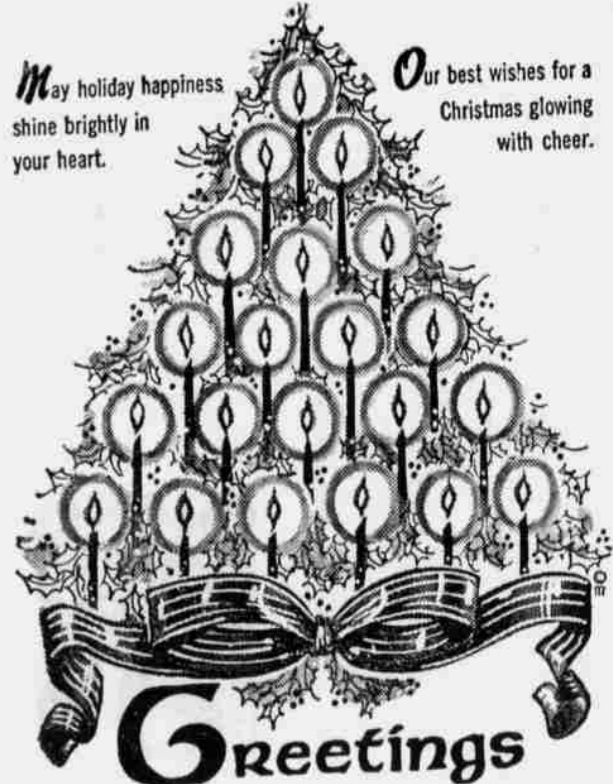
