Fine shooting and ball control kept the Mustangs just out of reach of the fighting Eagles to take the win.

In the February 4 contest the Mustangs traveled to Athena to play a much weaker club than the previous game. The little Mustangs were never in trouble as they ran up a 36-13 half-time score and coasted from there to victory. The two wins boost their record to eight wins and four losses.
