Many Thinclads Set Training For Track Season

Heppner High school tracksters turned out in numbers Monday, March 2 to answer Coach Don McClure's call for the initial practice. Thirty-four thinclads suited up to start indoor conditioning exercises for the coming season. McClure said that the turnout is the largest he has seen at Heppner.

Last year the Mustangs finished third in the sub-district and fourth in the district. Hopes are high in the Heppner camp that the Mustangs will finish even better this year.

Distance events appear to be the Heppner strong point this season. McClure pointed to the fact that the Mustangs have many capable boys in the distance runs, led by Lee Padberg, three-year veteran miler and half-miler who holds school records in both events. Padberg is also a veteran in the state meet as he has competed in both his specialties in the meet, finishing third in the mile and fifth in the half-mile his sophomore year, and third in the mile and sixth in the half-mile his junior year.

John Wagenblast is another veteran one-year letterman in the event for the Horsemen. Wagenblast turned in some promising times in the mile last year. Another strong point of the Mustang attack is the high jump, where Dave George has gone 5' 10".

Others who will compete for the Blue and Gold in track are: Ron Jones, sprints; Tim Driscoll, one-year letterman and Bill Weatherford, three-year letterman in the high and low hurdles; Bruce Spencer, one-year letterman, and Larry Muessig in the 440-yard run; Dean Robinson, two-year letterman, and Simon Winters, one-year letterman, in the 880-yard run.

The Mustangs will get their first taste of combat April 3 when the Grant Union Prospectors come to Heppner to meet the local crew in a dual meet. Coach McClure and his assistant, Jim Sutherland, are hopeful on this year's team's chances. McClure said, "We should do better this year. Although we are weak in the field events, we have more all-around depth, and this should make a difference. The Mustang cinder squad will practice during spring vacation.

Ione Boys Place In State Tourney

Three Ione youths placed high in the state high school trampoline competition of the state gymnastics tournament at MacArthur court, Eugene, Saturday.

Tom Heimbigner placed third in the state, Mark Halvorsen was sixth and Joe Halvorsen was seventh.

In the competition the three were against contestants from much larger schools. Winner of the trampoline event was Jack Walrath of South Eugene high, and second was Jim Healy of North Eugene.

The Ione trio was a little disappointed in their showing because they have done exceptionally well on the trampoline during the past two years, but they found that judges graded more severely on form this year than

they had anticipated. All-around individual winner in the gymnastics competition at the meet was Dave Telling, South Eugene with 43.8 points, followed by Charles Key, Roosevelt of Portland, 42.4, and Bob Leach, South Eugene, 42.

In all, 12 schools, most of them large A-1 schools, participated. Only small school listed on the program besides Ione was Sisters High school.

Accompanying the three to Eugene were Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Halvorsen and son Frank, Mr. and Mrs. Ray Heimbigner, and Coach Dick Strait.

The trampoline trio has been invited to perform at the half-time of the state B basketball championship game in Pendleton Saturday night and will appear there.
