

# Salem Scene

In addition to Oregon's fiscal problems, the 1965 Legislative Assembly will be faced with the problem of redistricting Oregon's four Congressional districts.

The United States Supreme Court ruled last February 17 that each member of the U. S. House of Representatives must be elected from Congressional districts roughly equal in population to other districts in the state.

Oregon's Congressional districts presently vary as widely as 522,813 in District Three (Multnomah county) to 265,164 in District Two (Eastern Oregon), a difference of 257,649 based on 1960 federal census figures.

Population by district: District 1, 517,678; District 2, 265,164; District 3, 522,813; District 4, 463,032.

The 6-3 Supreme Court decision cast doubt on the validity of the election of all but 37 of the 435 representatives, suggesting 398 U. S. House seats were filled unconstitutionally.

Some 20 states have greater district population difference than Oregon. Texas leads the pack with a difference of 735,156.

A bill (H. B. 1798) introduced at the 1963 regular Oregon Legislative session by Rep. John Mosser (R-Washington Co.) would have changed Oregon's Congressional districts in a manner limiting varying differences to 13,557, based on 1960 census figures.

Mosser's bill would have made

District One composed of Marion, Benton, Linn, Lane and Douglas counties. District Two would include all counties east of the Cascades in addition to Coos, Curry, Josephine and Jackson counties.

District Three would split Multnomah county, taking that portion east of the Willamette river in its boundaries.

District Four would be composed of Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln, Polk, Tillamook, Washington, Yamhill counties and that portion of Multnomah county west of the Willamette river.

Mosser Plan: District 1, 450,288; District 2, 436,711; District 3, 440,209; District 4, 440,499.

Mosser's bill was tabled in committee.

The high court's ruling "that the Constitution requires states to select Representatives either by election at large or by elections in districts composed as nearly as is practicable of equal population," places the Oregon Legislature in the position of doing one of two things:

State Congressional districts will either be redistricted to balance the population differences, or candidates will be required to run for office state-at-large.

In either case, the decision as to which way the Legislature will go in changing districts will depend greatly on which party is in control.
