Cards Threaten Heppner But Bow 65-52 at End

Heppner High ran its basketball string to four victories in a row as the Mustangs slipped away from the Cardinals of Ione there Saturday night, 65-52, in a tight contest.

The Mustangs, who ran away from the Cards in an earlier contest, found this game no pushover as the Ione club fought back hard and held the lead through much of the game.

Bill Snyder drew first blood for Heppner with only 30 seconds gone on a jumper from the corner. A minute later Stu Dick added a layin on a fast break to give the Mustangs a 4-0 lead. Heppner ran its lead to 10-3 but the Cards set out to narrow the gap and did just that, as the first quarter score showed only a three-point lead split, 16-13, in favor of the Mustangs.

Ione showed no awe at their A-2 adversary and set out to get revenge in the second period. Stan Holstein hit on a jumper from the side to cut the margin to one at 6:32. Exactly 30 seconds later Jay Ball put the Cards in front with a long set shot. Mark Halvorsen added a tip and the hosts were in front by three, 20-17.

Jim Doherty flipped up a layin at 4:48 to put the visitors within reach but fouls hurt at this point and five free throws later the Cards led 25-20. Heppner then came back with a torrid fast break and was only down by one at the half, 27-26. Three buckets by Wayne Evans kept them in the game at the last of the second period.

The Redbirds got the opening tip at the start of the second half and quickly turned their one-point margin into four at 32-28. The Horsemen were not to be outdone and at 5:55 led, 33-32. The lead then sawsawed back and forth, the Mustangs ending up on top, 42-40, at the end of three stanzas.

Mac Hoskins tipped to Tim Driscoll for a fast break at the start of the fourth and a minute later Stu Dick added a pair of free shots and the Mustangs had a 46-40 margin. The two rivals traded baskets until 4:22 of the period remained. As the Cards brought the ball down after Carl Bauman swished a pair of free throws, Bauman swiped the ball and raced the length of the court for an easy layin. A few seconds later he repeated the trick for two more tallies. Bauman swished a short jump making it eight in a row for him and the Mustangs had a lead of 56-48. After the Cards hit for four more counters Dave Anderson took over where Bauman had left off making the last five points for the Mustangs and

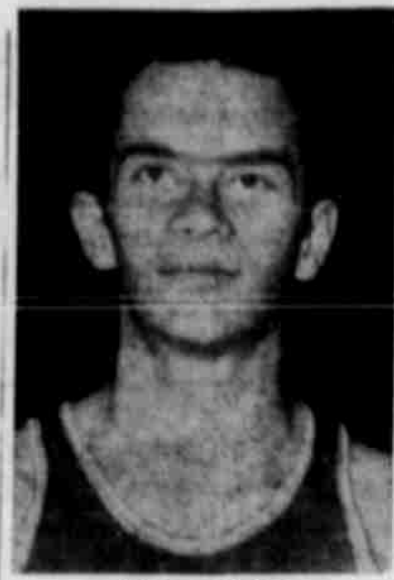

Heppner High moved up one rung in their fight for the Greater Oregon league basketball title when the Mustangs knocked off the third place Wahtonka Eagles on the local court Friday night, 74-65.

The Mustangs were headed only once as they demonstrated a lightning fast break and a full court press from the start of the game, but they found themselves up against the same treatment in the later stages of the encounter.

The game was no more than five seconds old when Jim Doherty laid up a soft shot to put Heppner out in front. The lead was only temporary as Bob Runie of the Eagles pumped in four quick points and with only 50 seconds of the game gone the Eagles were in front 6-2. The Mustangs kept one step ahead for the rest of the period and ended ahead, 17-12.

The Heppner lads drew first blood in the second period when, six ticks of the clock after the opening tip, Tim Driscoll put through a set from the side. The Eagles took a run at the locals midway in the quarter and narrowed the split to five points. The Heppner boys, still sporting their skinhead haircuts from two weeks back, were not to be outdone and quickly opened up for an 11 point spread with 3:51 of the half remaining. Still working the fast break, the hosts widened the margin to 44-30 at the intermission.

Coming back at a furious pace, the Mustangs opened up their lead to 19 before the Chenoweth team could get a chance to start to work. Most of the visitors' effort was fruitless, however, as the Heppner hoopsters led at the end of three, 58-43. Bruce Spencer had one-third of the team's third period points, racking up five on good inside shots.

Wahtonka came out to start the last stanza after what must have been a fiery pep talk, for the visitors promptly threw a full court press at the host Mustangs and narrowed the margin to 65-57 before Heppner went on a spurge. Wahtonka kept fighting back but the Mustangs traded bucket for bucket with them.

Heppner had four men in double figures, Stu Dick and Carl Bauman, with 18 each, and Tim Driscoll and Spencer, each with 11. Lucky Proctor claimed game honors with 22 for the Eagles, Jerry Harmon had 15 and Bob Runie chipped in 12.

Mustangs Whip DeSales; Post 5th Win of Season

The Mustangs of Heppner High extended their hottest win streak of the year to five games Tuesday night in the Heppner gym as they tumbled the DeSales Irish of Walla Walla, 58-47. The win gave the Mustangs their ninth victory against three losses for the season.

The Mustangs found the game no pushover. The determined Irish quickly ran up a lead, but Jim Doherty swished a pair of free throws to put the home team ahead with 2:32 of the first quarter left. Doherty fired a long set from outside and two more at the charity stripe, and the Mustangs were ahead to stay.

Heppner widened the spread to nine with 6:18 left in the first half when Mac Hoskins split the twine with a pair of gift shots, then went ahead to a 29-17 margin as Doherty got two at the line. That ended all Mustang scoring for the half and the Irish began to move, as they collected five fielders and a pair of free shots to tie it at intermission, 29-29.

In the third quarter Heppner quickly went ahead, 37-29, and held the lead at the end of the third stanza, 46-36. Hoskins had four of the team's third period tallies. Bill Snyder added two more on a beautiful hook and Dave Anderson chipped in a pair with 3:04 remaining on a rebound tip.

The Irish five would not give up and they came close to tipping the Heppner boys as they were within reach throughout the final period. With 3:12 on the clock they were down by only three at 50-47, but the Mustangs scored eight more to wrap it. Coach Bob Clough used a 10-man platoon system in the contest and the Mustangs used

their fast break to good advantage. Jim Doherty grabbed point honors for the Heppner team with 12 and Mac Hoskins was only one point back at 11.
