Valentine Given 5 Years Probation

Jim Valentine pleaded guilty to three charges, two of which were obtaining money under false pretenses and the third on larceny by embezzlement, in Morrow county circuit court March 5 with Judge William Wells on the bench.

Valentine was sentenced to five years in the penitentiary on each, running concurrently, but was then placed on probation to run concurrently for five years in each case.

He has agreed to make restitution of money involved. Phyllis Richardson was arraigned on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses, also in circuit court, and was to enter plea on March 16.

Robert Slayton, recently brought back to Morrow county from Oklahoma by Sheriff C. J. Bauman, was indicted by the Morrow county grand jury March 5 on a charge of burglary in a dwelling. He was arraigned in circuit court, plead not guilty and is held in Umatilla county jail in lieu of posting \$2500 bail. Bob Abrams is defense counsel.

Parole of Gene Baird of Hermiston was revoked by Judge Wells, and he was sentenced to serve six months in the Rocky Butte jail, Portland, Baird, originally sentenced in circuit court here in October on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses, had been placed on three years probation at that time. This was revoked because of parole violations.

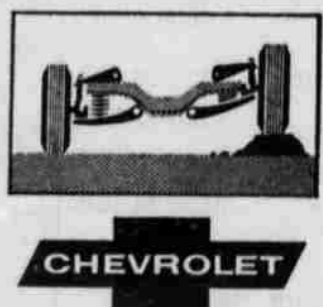
