IRRIGON — Irrigon City Council met last Tuesday evening, and the Landfill again came up for discussion. Mayor Chester Wilson and Councilman Harry Snyder reported on the trip they made to Heppner to talk with the County Court about the problem, and they stated the Landfill appropriation would be presented to the county budget committee as a budget item.

City Recorder Marguerite Houghton stated the dog licenses had arrived, and they are available from Mrs. Houghton. Dog owners will be given two weeks in which to secure a license, and the dog ordinance will be enforced after the first of April.
