# Varied Program Set For Homemaker Fete

"Meeting Change With Zest" is the topic Mrs. Buena Steinmetz will present at the 1965 Morrow County Homemaker Achievement Festival on Wednesday, May 12, according to Donna George, county extension agent.

Mrs. Steinmetz, a favorite speaker throughout Oregon on family life, formerly was extension family life specialist. A native of Oregon, she has also been a leader in the family life education program at Iowa State University.

She is currently president of the Oregon Home Economics Association.

The Homemaker Achievement Festival is the climax of the year's home extension program for the entire county. It will also include a dress revue of garments made in the tailoring workshop, exhibits by the home extension units depicting monthly lesson topics, and installation of unit and County Committee officers.

The Irrigon unit will present a skit relating to the lesson on "Tensions". A preview of special public meetings, workshops and unit lessons selected for 1965-66 will be announced by the program planning committee. Delegates attending the Oregon Home Extension State Council meeting this week-end will report on that event.

All interested persons are encouraged to attend the event to be held in the Rhea Creek Grange hall. Following a coffee

hour at 10:00 a.m. by the Boardman and Irrigon units the program will begin promptly at 10:30.

### Mrs. Cholly Discusses County's Health Program

Mrs. Lowell Cholly, county health nurse, met with the home extension program planners April 26 to discuss the county's health program. She reported most of the work is in schools, including health examinations, speech clinics held twice yearly in cooperation with Umatilla county, TB skin tests, orientation meetings for parents of preschoolers and immunization clinics. She reported a mobile TB X-ray unit will visit Irrigon, Boardman, and Heppner in August. Ninth and 10th grade girls are to be taught medical self-help in their health and P.E. classes.

There was much interest in the health pamphlets Mrs. Cholly brought. A packet of them will be assembled, then circulated to the home extension unit meetings in the fall. The program planners decided to encourage home extension units to consider sponsoring measles immunization clinics and to promote TB X-rays among members.

The committee also set up a rotation system for its membership and made final decisions on the 1965-66 home extension program which will be announced at the Homemakers Achievement Festival.

### Post Office Option Taken At Boardman

The Post Office Department has accepted an assignable land option for the site of a proposed new post office building at Boardman, Postmaster Flossie Coats has been advised.

The property, which is located on the northwest corner of the intersection of Boardman Avenue and First West, comprises approximately 14,325 square feet, and is presently owned by the Urban Renewal Agency of the city of Boardman.

The site option will be transferred to the successful bidder, who will purchase the land, construct the building to Post Office Department specifications, and lease it to the Post Office Department. The proposed building will contain 1,000 square feet of interior floor space, with 80 square feet of platform, and 3,780 square feet of parking and maneuvering area.

### Hams on Hornet

Seaman Richard L. Hams, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Vester S. Hams of Ione, is serving aboard the anti-submarine warfare support aircraft carrier USS Hornet, operating out of San Francisco, Calif. The Hornet provides the anti-submarine aircraft of the U. S. Pacific Fleet with a mobile landing field at sea.

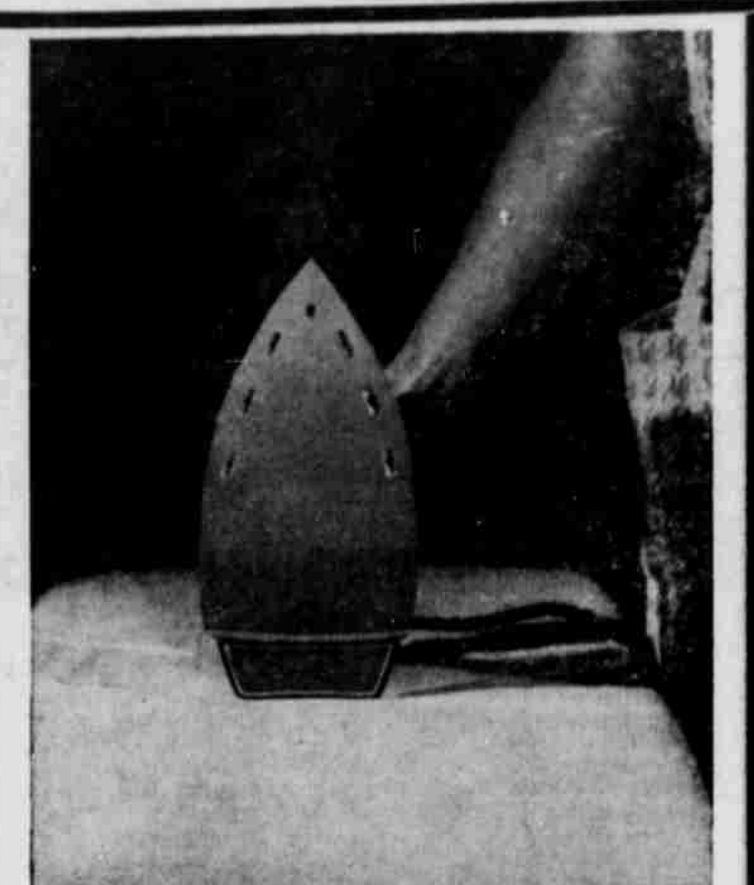

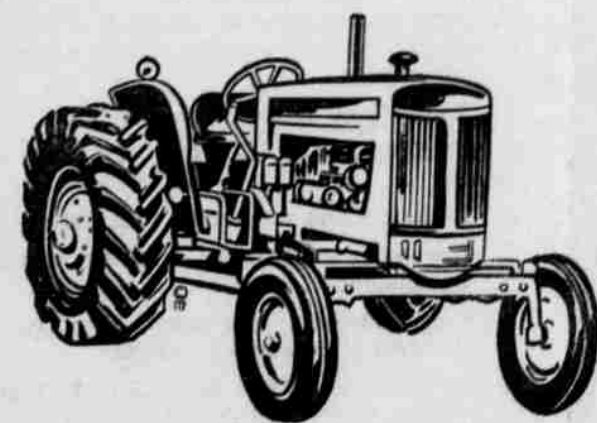
