Vale May Compete In West League

At a Greater Oregon league meeting held Saturday at Burns, Enterprise, Nyssa and Vale High schools were asked to compete in a representative athletic schedule or drop out of state competition. Athletic Director Pete Glennie of Heppner High school said.
 Vale indicated that it may participate with teams in the western division of the league in the year of 1966-67, but indications are that Nyssa will not. Because of their proximity to Idaho, both Nyssa and Vale have taken part in the Snake River Valley league, composed largely of Idaho schools, as well as in the eastern division of the Greater Oregon league. However, the eastern division is composed of only the three schools—Enterprise, Nyssa and Vale—and this is not considered "representative" competition.
 Ontario, an A-size school, faced a similar decision and chose to ally with Idaho, thereby relinquishing its right to compete in state tournaments.
 The action applies only to team sports, such as basketball, baseball, football and track, and does not apply to single member competitions, Glennie said.
