## Madras, Pomeroy Added to Heppner Athletic Slate

Madras High school, back in the A-2 ranks, and Pomeroy, Wash., are added to Heppner High athletic schedules for 1965-66.

Madras will compete in the Greater Oregon league, but Pomeroy will be a non-conference opponent. Football and basketball schedules for the Mustangs, already released, show Madras competing on both, while Pomeroy is on the football schedule only.

The series with Enterprise, played by the Mustangs for the past several years, is dropped from the football schedule. Heppner has three non-league games and five Greater Oregon games on its football schedule. The season opens on September 10 against Pilot Rock, which has dropped back to the class B ranks, and will no longer compete in the Greater Oregon league. This opener will be at Heppner at 8 p.m.

Second game of the year will be against the Blue Devils at Condon at 2 p.m. September 17. September 24 is open, after which the league schedule will start at The Dalles against Wah-tonka on October 1 at 2 p.m.

League games following in order are October 8, 8 p.m., Grant Union at John Day; October 15, 8 p.m., Madras at Heppner; October 22, 8 p.m., Burns at Burns; October 29, 8 p.m., Sherman at Heppner.

The non-conference game with Pomeroy will be played at the Washington town as the last game of the season on November 5 at 7:30.

Thus, the Mustangs will have only three home games this year.

Sixteen basketball games, plus the Christmas tournament at Condon, are listed for the Mustangs at this time. Ten of the games are conference contests, while DeSales of Walla Walla, Ione and Pilot Rock will furnish non-league competition.

First game will be December 10 against DeSales at Walla Walla. Remainder of the non-league schedule is as follows: December 11, Pilot Rock at Heppner; December 18, DeSales at Heppner; December 21, Ione at Ione; December 28 and 29, Christmas tournament at Condon; January 4, Pilot Rock at Pilot Rock and January 11, Ione at Heppner.

League season opens with a tough one on January 14, Madras at Madras. January 15 is open. On January 21, the Mustangs travel to Burns to face the Hillanders and follow with Grant Union at John Day on January 22, meaning they will have three very difficult games on the road at the start of the season.

On January 28 they will have their opening league game at home against Sherman county of Moro. January 29 is open, and on February 4, Wah-tonka comes to Heppner. February 5 is open, after which Madras plays at Heppner on February 11.
