Judge Declares Action Mistrial

Damage action of Joe Tatone of Boardman vs. West Extension Irrigation District in Morrow county circuit court Wednesday was declared a mistrial after Defense Counsel Gerald Pullen of Portland moved for the mistrial.

Jury had been selected and testimony was being heard when the motion was granted by Judge William Wells. The motion was based on what was considered improper testimony by a witness.

Tatone had sought damages of \$324 from the district as a result of alleged flooding on his pasture land from an irrigation ditch. He also asked for \$400 in attorney's fees.

Bob Mautz of Pendleton represented the plaintiff.

School Employees Need Certificates

Employees of the Morrow county schools are reminded that Oregon School Law requires a school health certificate to be registered with the county school office prior to the opening of school on September 7.

The requirements for a health certificate include either a current negative chest X-ray report or current negative tuberculosis skin test reading. Bus drivers are required to have yearly chest X-rays. Tuberculin skin tests or chest X-rays can be obtained from the private physician. Chest X-rays taken in the office of private physicians must be submitted for interpretation to specialists in chest disease or radiologists appointed by the Oregon State Board of Health, or may be sent directly to the Oregon State Board of Health, reading.

The free chest X-ray program formerly provided by the Morrow County TB and Health Association at the local hospital is no longer available as the program was suspended April, 1965, at the request of the hospital board.

Arrangements have been made by the Morrow County Health department and Eastern Council of Oregon Tuberculosis and Health for the OSBH Mobile Chest X-ray unit in August on the following dates: Ione, August 19, 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.; Heppner, August 20, 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., and 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.; and, on August 21 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. This service is available to all adults who wish chest X-rays.

All school health certificates must be countersigned by the county health officer through the local health department before they can be registered with the county school office.

The school health certificate cards for both chest X-ray and tuberculin skin test reports are available in the office of private physicians and at the Morrow county health office at the courthouse in Heppner.

The mobile chest X-ray unit is also scheduled to be in Pendleton July 27 and 28 at the rear of Eastern Oregon State Hospital from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.; and, July 29 at the Pendleton First National Bank from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. for any who might wish to avail themselves of this free service at that time.

Penland has been editor and publisher of the Herald and News since 1960 when he sold the Gazette-Times to W. O. Wildman. Associates in the Livermore paper were Fred Weybret and Ray Anderson, formerly owners of the La Grande Observer and now publishers of the Lodi, Calif., News-Sentinel.
