Convention Slated On 18-Year-Old Vote

A spokesman for the Oregon Committee for the 18-Year-Old Vote announced today that a state convention for supporters of the lower voting age will be held in Salem, at the Marion Hotel, Saturday, July 31.

The committee has filed with the Secretary of State an initiative petition that will place the measure on the 1966 General Election ballot after 55,000 signatures are obtained. Supporters will begin circulating the petition shortly prior to the

convention. The forthcoming convention is the first state-wide meeting of 18-year-old vote advocates, called by the temporary committee leadership. Present officers are State Representative Howard Willis, Portland, Legal Signer; Dennis Becker, Yamhill, Chairman; and Paul Nobisch, Salem, Treasurer. The convention agenda includes formal organization of the committee and election of new officers. The organization's membership consists
