For her wedding the bride wore a street length sheath of ivory lace over satin, with matching accessories. She carried a bouquet of red roses and white carnations.

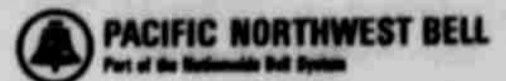
