

747 Have Chest X-Rays Taken at Visit of Mobile Unit

A total of 747 chest X-rays were taken by the mobile X-ray unit of the Oregon State Board of Health at Ione and Heppner Thursday through Saturday, according to Mrs. H. J. Stroeber, general chairman.

This is equivalent to one-seventh of the county's total population, and the hard-working local committees were delighted with the response.

Cliff Herbage of Portland, technician with the unit, reported that 138 pictures were taken in Ione Thursday afternoon, 405 in Heppner through the day Friday, and 184 in Heppner on Saturday morning, for a total of 747.

Beta Omega chapter of Epsilon Sigma Alpha was in charge of arrangements in Ione, and they were given credit for an exceptional job. Working on the committee were Mrs. Alice Crawford, Mrs. Eugene Dockter, Mrs. Art Lindstrom, publicity chairman, Mrs. Ralph Kincaid and Mrs. Joe Hausler.

on duty during the lunch hour, however.

As at the high school, daily schedule calls for the elementary school to take up at 8:45 a.m. Lunch period at the elementary school will be about 45 minutes but will vary somewhat and will be staggered to accommodate the various age groups, Grossnickle said.

A \$1.25 fee will be charged pupils in grades one through four, and a \$1.50 fee will be charged those in grades five through eight. These fees will cover assemblies, room fees for parties and programs, and student body dues, the principal said.

Also for students who take a regular physical education class, a \$2 towel fee will be charged, and for the older students engaging in sports, a \$1 towel fee will be charged for each sport.

A list of school supplies to be required for grades one through eight has been prepared by the school and copies are available at the school. They have also been supplied to local stores, which, therefore, are in a position to inform parents of children of the needs.

Ione Schools
At Ione High and Elementary any high school students who have not pre-registered. Others need not appear at that time.

Except for towel fees, the fee schedule is the same as at Heppner schools.

Towel fees at Ione High school will be \$2 for physical education and \$1 per sport. At the grade school they will be \$1 for physical education and 50c per sport. Difference in the towel fees between schools of the district is the difference in the cost of laundering, Supt. Potter explained.

Riverside, Boardman
Riverside High and Boardman elementary will conduct registration for all students on Thursday, September 2, starting at 10:30 a.m. Buses will make regular runs to pick up students for these schools on that day. These are the only buses that will run in the county prior to schools registration will be Fri-
