Milton-Freewater Paper Reports On 82 Freeway

A story in the last issue of the Milton-Freewater paper, The Valley Herald, will be of interest to those who have been concerned about the route of proposed Interstate Highway 82. It reports on an interview with a Washington State highway engineer and is as follows:

"The Umatilla Bridge crossing of the Columbia River may not be mandatory in selecting the route of Interstate Highway 82," a Washington highway official said Monday in Walla Walla. W. H. "Chub" Foster, Yakima district engineer, told the Valley Herald that "we have not yet considered a route east of Van Sycle canyon." Foster said he was not familiar with the proposal voiced by Oregon's Congressman Al Ullman that the route of Interstate Highway 82 could run from the Tri-Cities to Walla Walla, thence up the Walla Walla River valley to a point near Walla Walla and through Milton-Freewater and connecting with Interstate 80-N at the foot of the Blue Mountains east of Pendleton.

Avoids By-Pass Discussion
Foster who appeared before the Walla Walla Kiwanis Club to discuss the by-pass of Washington highway 410 around Walla Walla, was reluctant to discuss the possible re-routing of Interstate 82.

He explained that Washington and Oregon highway officials had agreed to an independent study of the Umatilla Bridge as well as other possible routes. "The capability of the Umatilla Bridge is sub-standard for federal interstate highway requirements, however," he said. The study will consider the Umatilla Bridge-Horse Heaven Hills route which would by-pass the Tri-Cities, an alternate route through the Tri-Cities and up Van Sycle Canyon, as well as a "third alternative."

"Umatilla Crossing Wanted"
"We have long understood that Oregon wanted the Umatilla crossing," Foster explained.

Close on the heels of Foster's remarks Monday in Walla Walla came the announcement from Salem that the Washington State Highway Department would conduct a traffic survey in Oregon's Umatilla county the next two weeks.

The Oregon Highway Department said the survey would be conducted at four stations in the Boardman-Pendleton area to help determine location of the Interstate Highway 82.

To Connect With 80-N
The controversial Interstate 82 highway will connect 80-N in Oregon with Interstate 90 in Washington. Washington's Tri-Cities are working toward relocation of the highway in that area rather than over the Horse Heaven Hills to the Umatilla crossing.

The Oregon Highway Department and Pendleton interests want the new highway to cross the Columbia at the Umatilla Bridge, a considerable distance west of the Tri-City area.

Possibility of re-locating highway 82 elsewhere than at the Umatilla crossing depend on additional federal funds to provide for more highway mileage.
