Carpenter Heads National Seal Campaign for '65

Scott Carpenter, who hurtled three times around the earth in the Aurora 7 capsule, heads the 1965 Christmas Seal Campaign as its honorary chairman.

"I grew up in a family that was strong for Christmas Seals," the astronaut recalls. As a result of the case detection and medical research encouraged by tuberculosis associations, his mother's case of TB was arrested. She was able to live in good health for many years, although she eventually died of the disease in 1962.

Commander Carpenter's working knowledge of the probes into space and undersea have impressed him with the importance of good respiratory health, and feels that the Christmas Seal Campaign is the best way to succeed in the TB and respiratory disease fight.

The 50th annual seal campaign is now underway and purchase of seals will be important to the continuing program of the Eastern Region of Oregon TB and Health Association. Last year's program in this region included tuberculin skin

tests for children in elementary schools, educational materials for hospitals, schools, college, and public information on tuberculosis, especially emphysema. Seminar scholarships were granted to 11 teachers, ten schools participated in the annual school press project and the Eastern Region received four of the nine state awards.
