## Willow Project Meetings Planned

Three governmental agencies have been contacted to set up information meetings on the Willow Creek project and particularly the irrigation feature of the project. County Judge Paul Jones told the Heppner-Morrow County Chamber of Commerce Monday, November 29.

He said that he has contacted the Bureau of Reclamation, the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, and the State Water Resources Board. The judge said that Quentin Bowman of the Water Resources Board will be in Heppner soon.

The judge said that he had submitted a list of some 30 questions that had been asked him about the project to the governmental agencies. Niel Mead-owcroft of the Army Engineers, Walla Walla, had asked that such a list of questions be prepared in order to serve as a guide on information sought.

The judge said that when such informational meetings could be arranged, they will be announced in time for all interested to be given an opportunity to attend.

Harley Young, first vice president of the Chamber, proposed that the organization hire a coordinator to assist in gathering information and making contacts towards organizing the needed irrigation district. The matter was discussed briefly on the floor, and Judge Jones said he favored such a move.

"We need all the community effort we can get to put this thing together," he said, authorized by Congress, now needs federal appropriations before it may proceed. This step is largely dependent upon the formation of an irrigation district to provide for this feature of the multipurpose project, according to a statement from Congressman Al Ullman on his recent visit here.
