## Heppner Swamps Enterprise Team

Heppner's Mustangs had little trouble Friday night as they swamped the Enterprise Savages, 77-39, in a non-league basketball game here. Jim Doherty and Gene Heliker started things off as they hit six in a row from the field, which seemed to demoralize the Savages.

Heliker, coming into the game with a hot hand, immediately poured in 10 points in the first period. Doherty also hit for six quick counters, and the Horsemen jumped off to a quick 26-13 lead.

The Savages showed no threat after the first half and the Mustangs' "other five" held their rivals to 16 points during the second half.

The victors ripped the nets with a shooting percentage of .46. Enterprise seemed to have a lid on the basket with an anemic 19.5 percentage.

Mac Hoskins, sitting out the fourth quarter, collected 13 rebounds and 18 points. Gene Heliker, sharing high point honors with Hoskins, also had 18 points, hitting 9 for 19 from the field. Jim Doherty played an outstanding game of defense and ball control as he hit for 11 points, followed by Tim Driscoll with 10.

## Cason Services Held in Portland

Funeral services were conducted for Margaret Osten Cason, a descendant of a Morrow county pioneer family, at Finley Mortuary in Portland on Saturday, January 8. Officiating minister was the Rev. Charles Knox, former pastor of the Heppner Christian church. Interment followed at Mountain View Cemetery in Oregon City.

Mrs. Cason was born in Grant county March 25, 1891, the daughter of Charles and Alice (Hunsaker) Osten. She died Jan. 4 following an illness of several months at her home at Beaverton.

She is survived by her husband, Lewis Cason of Beaverton; one daughter Betty Fickard of Ingleswood, Calif., and two grandchildren, Steve and Peggy Estberg of Beaverton.

Mrs. Cason started teaching in Eastern Oregon when she was 17 years old. She retired in 1952. Her pupils have included three generations in the same family, and her services varied from a tiny rural school to the training school at the Southern Oregon College of Education, where she was a training teacher for 13 years. Mrs. Cason will be remembered by her friends and students as a person of unusual sympathy and understanding.

Several friends and relatives from the Heppner area attended the memorial service.

## Tuberculin Tests Start This Week

A tuberculosis case-finding program is planned for Morrow County Schools in January by the Morrow County Health Department, under the direction of Dr. L. D. Tibbles, health officer.

A signed consent slip from the parent or guardian is necessary before the tests can be given.

Grades scheduled for Tuberculin Test are 1, 7 and 12. Parents are notified of results if a positive reaction is found, and a follow-up chest X-ray recommended. The tests are read from 48 to 72 hours after being given.

Materials for Tuberculin Test testing are provided by the Morrow County Council of the Eastern Region, Oregon TB and Health Association, through Christmas seal sales.

Proposed schedule for testing is as follows: January 14 at Heppner High school, followed by Heppner Grade school, Seventh Day Adventist school and Lone High and Grade School (January 17, reading of tests), January 21 at Boardman Grade School and Riverside High. A. S. Houghton at Irrigon to follow (January 24, reading of tests).

Lone High's basketball team broke a losing streak over the week-end with a pair of victories over league opponents and cracked into the Morrow-Umatilla B-league win column.

The Cards jolted Stanfield, 69 to 43, at Stanfield Friday night and edged a good Helix team at Lone Saturday night, 67-64, with a come-from-behind triumph.

Coach Gene Doherty used all his players in the Stanfield contest with the Cards jumping to a quick lead and holding a 23-11 margin at the end of the first quarter. Other quarter stops favored Lone 38-21 and 54-32.

Not more than five points separated Lone and Helix in the Saturday night game but the visitors led at the first three quarter stops.

With three minutes remaining the Cards trailed by two, but Ball sank two free throws to tie the game. John Olsen of Helix moved his team in front when he connected on the first of two free throws. Stan Holstein then had two chances when he was fouled. He missed both but Halvorsen tipped in the second shot, giving Lone a one-point edge.

Helix missed a field goal try, then Virgil Morgan was fouled. He made both shots and Lone was ahead by three. Olsen closed the gap to one when he pumped in a short one for Helix. With seconds to go Halvorsen hit a jumper for lone's final 3-point margin.

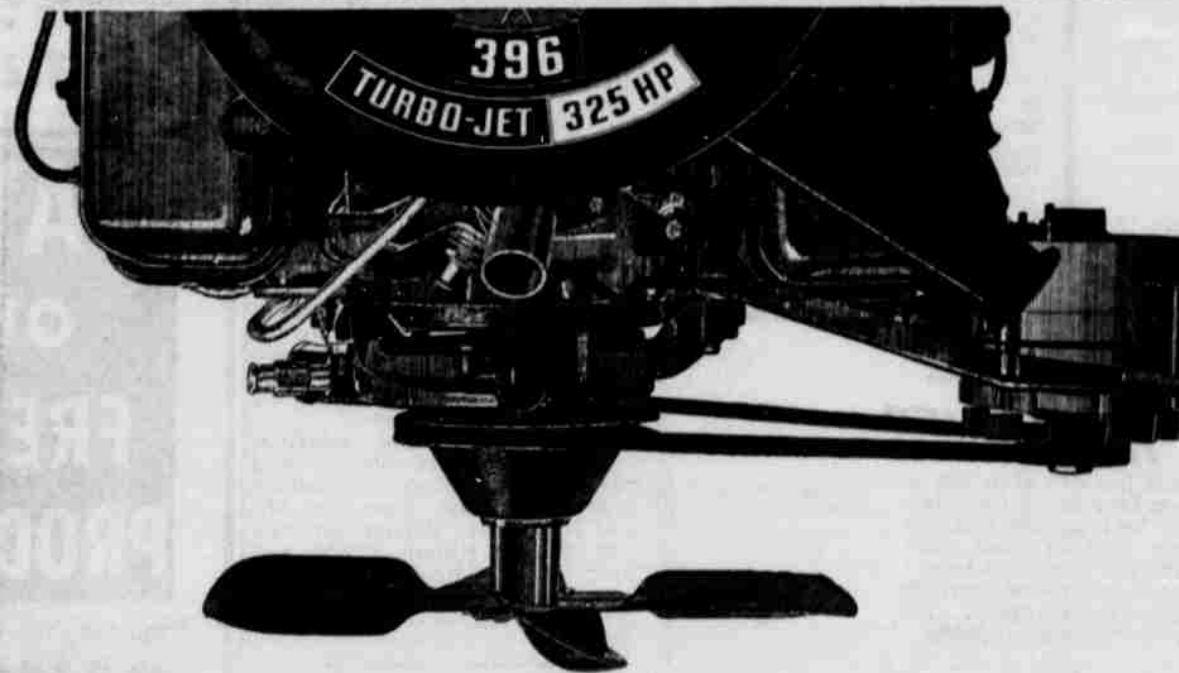
