Buchanan Named To Tax Committee

Appointment of Martin H. Buchanan of Milton-Freewater to the legislative tax study committee has been announced by Senate President Harry D. Boivin of Klamath Falls.
 Buchanan will replace Austin Dunn of Baker who has served as a member of the committee since its inception, and who recently resigned.

Buchanan, a Democrat, served on the Oregon Liquor Control Commission for seven years. He is now a director and chairman of a grain growers cooperative, and has been a school board member.
 Created by the 1965 Legislature and chaired by Senator Gene Stadler of Eugene, this permanent 11 man committee is studying the problems of taxation of the state, counties, cities and municipalities. It will make recommendations to the 1967 and subsequent legislative sessions. Studies include suitable sharing of tax burdens and benefits, basic changes and new sources of revenue, efficiency in tax administration and other facets of Oregon's increasing tax problems.
