Robert C. Benson, U. S. Forest Service, of Heppner participated in a special range management short course at Oregon State University last week.

The program stressed the organization and operation of grazing and pasture lands. Grazing management is being examined from the standpoint of livestock, soil, wildlife, and plant requirements.

Adopting a grazing scheme to fit an individual area's resources is the key to this phase of range management. Gates explains. Too often range managers incorrectly assume that they can fit their resources to a previously devised system.
