Club is Informed On School Budget By Administrator

Discussion of the 1966-67 county school budget was presented by Superintendent David Potter to members and guests of the Soroptimist club at its noon luncheon meeting last Thursday. He was accompanied and introduced by Jack Grossnickle, elementary school principal.

Two senior girl guests were Sandra McDonald and Teresa Monahan.

All areas of the school budget were presented and detailed fact sheets were projected on a large screen to show visual figures of estimated incomes and expenses budgeted for the coming year. Explanations were given of the three areas which show an increase over the previous year, and a small decrease was pointed out in the total amount allowed for instruction, through combining or eliminating some areas of special instruction.

Several questions were asked throughout the discussion especially in regard to outlay for laundry equipment, Morgan street improvements, school lunch programs, swimming pool facilities, gymnasium repairs, estimated incomes from proper-

ty taxes, and others.

The administrators urge the cooperation of the public in turning out for the budget election on Tuesday, April 12, throughout the district.
