

Trackmen Thump Prineville 99-32, In Friday Meet

Paced by Tim Smith, junior, who set a record in the two-mile, the Heppner trackmen clobbered their hosts, the Prineville Cowboys, Friday by a 99-32 score.

Although the windswept track slowed times, the Heppner boys came up with some fine early-season marks. They won 13 of the 15 events, completely overshadowing the larger A-1 school.

Husky Jim Jacobs, triple-winner in the shot put, 100 and 220 dashes and Dave Hall, victor in both hurdle races, were outstanding for the Mustangs. But Smith stole the spotlight. His 10:28.8 two-mile eclipsed the former 10:32 standard set by Mark Brown, despite the swift wind and lack of pressing competition.

Another top mark posted was that of the HHS 880-relay team which clocked a fast time of 1:39.9. Included on this team were Dean Kindle, a fleet-footed freshman; Ken Morgan; Simon Winters and Dave Hall.

The Mustangs took first and second places in seven events. They failed to win only in the javelin and discus. All three places in the broad jump were swept by the HHS spikers.

For the meet, which was scored on a basis of five points for first, three for second and one for third, Jacobs tallied 15 points. Hall, who added a second in the broad jump to his winning relay team, scored 144 points.

The J.V. team lost by a 62 to 69 score. The unit will be stationed all day Tuesday, April 26, in lone at the Chevron station, and will be parked adjacent to Murrays' Drug Store in Heppner all day Wednesday, April 27.

Anthony Haberlach, newly-appointed program director for this region, and Donald M. Harman, case-finding consultant for the Tuberculosis and Health Association, met with the local association Tuesday night to plan for the advertising, staffing, and business contact committee necessary for a visit by the unit.

Mrs. Herman Green will be in charge of soliciting the volunteer committee which will staff the unit during its seven hours in Heppner.
