

Boardman City Council Adopts Water Schedule

BOARDMAN—The City Council held its first meeting in the new city hall Tuesday evening of last week. A schedule of residential and commercial water rates was adopted as follows: 3/4 inch meter \$2.50 minimum for 6,000 gallons; 1 inch meter \$3.00 minimum for 8,000 gallons; 1 1/2 inch meter \$4.00 minimum for 10,000 gallons; 2 inch meter \$6.00 minimum for 12,000 gallons; from 6,000 to 12,000 gallons, \$20 a thousand; from 30,000 to 100,000 \$15 a thousand; over 100,000 gallons \$12 a thousand; all rates are to be reviewed in six months. Irrigation rates \$0.5 a thousand and for the number of gallons used over an average of the winter months use. Rates must be applied for and approved. Sewer rates are residential \$2.00 a month, commercial 50% of metered water charges.

In other action Ernael Mithersdorf was appointed as budget officer. Members of the budget committee and dates of meetings will be published at a later date.

At a short Urban Renewal Agency meeting a residential lot was sold to Seth Russell. The agency voted to participate in the plumbing program of the new 4-H building to be built in the city park.

The Tru-Lay Paving company was awarded the contract for \$1,091.80 to round out and pave all four corners of Front and Main Streets.
