

## New Restaurant Underway In New Boardman Area

**BOARDMAN**—A new restaurant and lounge which will seat 225 people is now under construction by Joe Tatone in the new Boardman townsite.

A two story all daylight structure, 60 x 100 feet, it will have 5,000 square feet of dining and lounge space on the first floor, and 4,000 square feet of banquet space on the second floor. It is in modern western design and will be called the Dodge City.

Tatone is acting as general contractor for his building and stated that he anticipated about 90 days for construction.
