WHEREAS, a notice of hearing has been duly published in a newspaper of general circulation within Morrow County, and WHEREAS, said hearing has been held, and now therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that an election for the establishment of the proposed Park and Recreation Maintenance District be held on July 22, 1966, and at such election, five members of the Park and Recreation Board be voted for.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that this order shall be entered in the Journal of the County Court along with all petitions and papers filed pursuant to the formation of this proposed district.

Duncan Supports Information Bill

Rep. Robert B. Duncan (D-Ore.) said June 21 that "any responsible public officer holder will have to acknowledge—indeed, should acknowledge—that the result of a free press has been overwhelmingly beneficial."

Duncan made his statement in expressing his support for a "Freedom of Information" measure passed by the House 307 to 0. The identical bill has been approved by the Senate and the bill now goes to the President for signature.

The bill would require most categories of activities of agencies of the Executive Branch be open to public scrutiny. It provides a court test when information is denied a citizen. It does provide for certain categories of information in the area of national security to be withheld.

"Passage of this freedom-of-information bill is not the final chapter," Duncan said. The campaign against secrecy in government is never entirely permanently won. But the bill represents a firm and wide step forward — long delayed and long-overdue. Other liberalizing chapters remain to be written. And these, too, will have my support."

Duncan said the history of this country is incomplete without discussion of the press and its shaping impact upon government. He said no one in public life has not at some time wished a newspaper "had not printed such and such a story, but Thomas Jefferson once said that he preferred newspapers without government to government without newspapers."

Duncan said that when he was Speaker of the Oregon House of Representatives for a precedent-making two consecutive terms he insisted on open sessions of legislation committees. "This was the public's gain and the legislature was certainly the better for it. The Congress would be the better for it—if such a policy were in existence," he said.
