

Ione Area Severely Hurt By Hail, Water Damages

IONE—A severe hail storm struck wheat ranches in this community last Thursday resulting in heavy damages. Fields of barley and wheat in the Eightmile, Gooseberry, Rhea Creek, and Fourmile areas, all south of Ione, suffered all the way from 30 to 100 percent damage. Washouts on the Rhea Creek, Brenner Canyon, and Fourmile roads occurred.

A water spout again hit the Donald Linnell ranch near Morgan with high water washing through their barnyard and taking out corral fences. During the December flood they sustained much damage to their ranch and also lost some cattle and a cattle truck. The cattle were out of reach of flood waters this time. They measured over 92 inches of rain in just a few minutes late Thursday afternoon.

Water came rushing down the canyon at Cecil, through the corrals and barns of Krieb Bros. sheep camp and on down the road surrounding the Cecil store with high water for a time.

South of Ione at the Earl Akers ranch .96 inches of rain fell in about 20 minutes, although they did not sustain as much hail damage as their neighbors. At the Raymond Lundell ranch 57 inches of hail and rain fell.

On Rhea Creek the Padberg farm was flooded with water from the hillsides and canyons covering the hay fields and surrounding the house.

North of Ione wheat ranches had a terrific wind and rain storm for a few minutes, but in most instances harvest continued the next afternoon. Rain measured less than .20. Some barley fell from the wind and harvesters were having trouble picking it up.
