Variety of travel, including bus, boat, plane and train, was experienced by Mrs. Clara Gertson on a three-week tour into Canada and Alaska. Mrs. Gertson returned Sunday, July 24, from the memorable "Green Carpet" Alaska Adventure Tour, sponsored by the national travel service, Trailways.

A chartered plane took them high above the beautiful snow-capped mountains to Nome and to the typically Alaskan community of Kotzebue just north of the Arctic Circle, where they viewed Eskimos in their native customs of fishing and trapping. A visit to Fairbanks provided them with an extra excursion trip to see the beauties of Mt. McKinley National park.

The tourists found the weather cool and damp during much of the trip, but warmer on the return trip down the inland Alaskan highway. Many of the beautiful snow-capped mountains were closed in by fog but the trip left many favorable impressions on Mrs. Gertson, her first trip into the Alaskan country.
