Car, Truck Hit; 3 Slightly Hurt

A car driven by Mrs. Shirley Rugg collided Saturday with a truck loaded with her own wheat at the junction of Sanford Canyon with the Rhea Creek road.

Mrs. Rugg and her two daughters, occupants of the car, received minor injuries. Roger Britt, driver of the truck, which was owned by Ellis Pettyjohn, was unhurt.

Mrs. Rugg sustained a cut in her scalp requiring 10 stitches at the Pioneer Memorial hospital. Jody, 14, had a cut that required four stitches at the hairline on her forehead and suffered a bruise to the head. Jill, 12, had mouth and nose injuries. Mrs. Rugg remained in the hospital overnight but the girls were released after treatment.

Ironically, the load of wheat was the last of the harvest for Mrs. Rugg. The vehicles met at the junction when Mrs. Rugg directed the truck to head for town but instead it turned down the other road.

The Rugg car was severely damaged but the truck took only slight damage in the collision.

As a result of the impact, the car was well sprinkled with wheat and the motor was pretty well covered with grain.

The three in the car did not have seat belts fastened, it was reported. If the belts had been in use, the injuries may not have happened.
