## Bank of EO Offers New Credit Card

Through cooperation with the U. S. National Bank of Oregon, the Bank of Eastern Oregon is making available the U. S. BankAmericard in the Heppner, Lexington and Lone areas, according to Gene Pierce, president of the Bank of Eastern Oregon.

In making the announcement, Pierce said that the all-purpose card, first of its type in the state and a success for over eight years in California, will be in operation this fall. Currently member agreements are being offered to businessmen in the area.

Following this initial sign-up of businessmen, the card will be made available to individuals, and these individuals need not be customers of the Bank of Eastern Oregon or the U. S. National Bank of Oregon.

Under the agreement, a merchant assumes no credit risk, thus freeing the businessman's capital and not tying it up in accounts receivable. At the end of each day, the businessman bank and receives immediate credit in his account.

At the end of the month, instead of receiving a bill from each firm where merchandise was purchased, the customer receives one bill. The customer then pays only the total of his sales tickets or may stretch his payments over a period of time with a nominal service charge.
