### Safety Keynote To Automotive 4-H Club Projects

Through membership in automotive programs, 4-Hers from coast to coast contribute to safety on the expressways, city streets and country roads. Both teen-age drivers and pre-drivers are engaged in 4-H automotive projects, according to T. W. Thompson, service director of the National 4-H Service Committee.

With the help of authoritative manuals, 4-Hers work on both the inside and outside of the vehicle, said Thompson. Checking mechanical defects, safety hazards and keeping the vehicle clean are some of the main jobs.

Showing young people how and why the family car or truck performs as it does, and calling on traffic officers, mechanics, safety engineers and extension specialists to advise and instruct, makes this program an excellent supplement to other driver education, Thompson reports.

Successful car check and safety campaigns have been inaugurated by 4-H automotive clubs. Many have become annual events attracting hundreds of motorists.

Girls are as enthusiastic about the program as are the boys. Each year they claim their share of honors. All 4-Hers have a chance to win county, state and national recognition and awards provided by the program sponsor, The Firestone Tire & Rubber Company.

### Home Canning Made Easy for 4-H Girls

The job of putting up bushels of tomatoes, peaches, beans and pickles is no longer the tedious and back-breaking chore it was in grandmother's day. Methods and techniques in home canning and freezing are constantly being simplified.

Perhaps that is the reason the National 4-H Food Preservation program has remained one of the favorites of 4-H girls for nearly half a century. It is supervised by the Cooperative Ex-

tension Service. Not only can more varieties of foods be preserved by today's methods, but choice can be made as to canning or freezing, depending on the home needs and situation. The 4-Her also takes into consideration the nutritional value

of foods to preserve, having learned about nutritional needs in 4-H foods projects. She has an eye on saving dollars in the family food budget, and takes pride in being able to serve out-of-season treats at a moment's notice.

"Magic dishes," Mrs. Ruth Kerr calls them. And she should

know because she is a pioneer in the home canning field, and has a close tie to 4-H.

The Kerr Glass Manufacturing Corporation, of which she is president, has sponsored the national 4-H Food Preservation program since 1929.
