

Hunters Urged To Check Rules For Hunt Seasons

Oregon hunters are urged by the game commission to check the arms and ammunition rules for both big game and upland game birds. Following is a breakdown of some of these regulations, but hunters should check the regulations synopsis for complete information:

It is unlawful to use shotguns loaded with buck or bird shot to hunt or kill big game animals, except that buck shot may be used in the Northwest Agricultural Area extended deer season. Hunters may use shotguns for deer hunting provided rifled slugs are used.

Youth Seen Firing Into Herd of Bulls

As Loren Lucore, fire control officer for the Heppner Ranger district, was driving on the Willow Creek road towards Heppner one day last week, he noticed a youth in a car ahead firing into a herd of bulls on the Dick Wilkinson place.

Lucore speeded up in an effort to catch the car, but the driver gave his vehicle gas, too, a state police officer said. However, Lucore was able to obtain the license number of the car. It was believed that two youths are involved.

The officer said that the car is apparently registered to a Portland owner, and the two may be from Portland. If identity can be established, a citation will be issued, he said.

It is unlawful to use pistols or revolvers to hunt or kill big game animals.

It is unlawful to use shotguns larger than 10 gauge to hunt or kill any game animals.

It is unlawful to use semi-automatic rifles with a magazine capacity of more than five cartridges. It is also illegal to use any military or full metal-jacketed bullet in original or altered form.

It is unlawful to use rifles with a caliber designation of less than .25 inch and developing less than 1220 foot pounds of energy at 100 yards for the taking of elk, bighorn sheep, and mountain goats.

It is unlawful to use rifles with a caliber designation of less than .23 inch for the taking of all other big game animals.

The long bow and cross bow may be used in the general seasons in lieu of shotguns or rifles; however, the cross bow may not be used in lieu of the long bow in a specific archery season.

Upland bird and waterfowl shooters may hunt with shotguns of 10 gauge or smaller capable of holding no more than three shells and using shot no larger than BB. Tracer ammunition is prohibited. Long bows and arrows may also be used for bird hunting.

Pheasant Season To Open Saturday

Oregon gunners will have a full slate of upland game birds on the shooting line this coming week-end with the opening of the general season for ring-neck pheasants and mountain and valley quail.

Already open is the season for chukar partridge, Hungarian partridge, and blue and ruffed grouse. Hunters are reminded that this will be the last week-end for grouse, with the season scheduled to close October 23.

The pheasant and quail season opener is scheduled for 8:00 a.m., Saturday, October 22. This 8 o'clock opening applies to all upland game birds and waterfowl on that date. For the remainder of the season, hunters may begin shooting one-half hour before sunrise.

Pheasant season will extend through November 27. Hunters have a split bag limit this year—3 cocks daily, 12 in possession in eastern Oregon except Klamath County, and 2 cocks daily, 8 in possession in western Oregon and Klamath County.

Quail gunners in western Oregon will have a season extending through November 27, while hunters in eastern Oregon may take quail through January 15. Bag limit on quail is set for 10 daily in the aggregate, 20 in possession.

Upland game bird and waterfowl hunters are urged to obtain copies of the regulations which are available at all license dealers.

Mule Buck Season Ends October 23

Big game hunters are reminded that the general mule deer season throughout eastern Oregon is scheduled to close one-half hour after sundown on October 23.

The closure takes in all of eastern Oregon lying to the east of the Santiam, McKenzie, Dixon, and Rogue game management units. In general, this boundary extends along the summit of the Cascades.

Hunters can continue their quest for black-tailed deer in western Oregon through October 30. Open area includes all units west of the east boundary of the Santiam, McKenzie, Dixon, and Rogue units.

Buck hunters on the west side are limited to taking buck deer with at least a forked antler.
