Fair, Rodeo Dates Chosen for 1967; Dance Policy Set

Dates of August 22 through 25 have been approved by the Morrow County Fair Board for the 1967 fair and Saturday, August 26, and Sunday, August 27, have been officially set as the rodeo dates. The dates were approved at the regular meeting of the fair board last week. Fred Mankin reported at the meeting that barns have been cleaned and are ready to be sprayed. As was reported earlier in the Gazette-Times, barns will be locked up for at least one year to disinfect.

The fair board requests that all persons interested in having dances at the fair pavilion contact the fair board at least one month in advance so there will be no conflicts with other activities held there, and so the fair board can approve these dances at their regular monthly meetings.

Also, these persons must appear at the fair board meetings, held the third Monday of each month, for approval. This avoids calling the fair secretary and board members at their homes as an approval by all members is necessary.

It is also requested that persons make plans well in advance of dances or other activities they wish held there instead of at the very last minute.

The dances must be policed with at least two policemen and must be well chaperoned. Approval will be given for these dances only after chaperones have been contacted, assuring the fair board of their presence during the entire length of the dance.
