

Cardinals Top Wishram In Overtime Game

Six free throws in overtime gave Ione High school's basketball team a hard-fought 66-62 victory over Wishram on the Washington school's floor Saturday night.

The Cardinals had built up a good margin by the end of the third quarter and seemed to have the situation under control at 48 to 36 in their favor when the home team broke loose for 24 points in the final stanza. Ione accounted for only 12 in the same period and the regular play ended in a 60-60 deadlock.

Going was rough in the late stages of the game, but Ione turned the Wishram fouls to its advantage in the extra playing time. Jim Swanson, Frank Halvorsen and Eddie Sherman each connected on two free throws while Wishram was able to score only two points.

The Cardinals had taken a 20-13 edge in the game by the end of the first quarter, and widened the gap to 37-26 by halftime. Their field goal shooting was not bad for their opening game with 35% average, coming on 20 buckets in 55 attempts. Wishram, a team of "tall firs," had nearly twice as many chances at 95, but connected on only 21. Ione hit 26 of 42 free throws while Wishram made 20 of 27.

Sophomore Jim Swanson led the Cardinals with 16, while Eddie Sherman, another soph-

omore, potted 12. Leon Magill and Chris Lovgren each had 11. Chudnik was high for Wishram with 14.

Mustang Hoopers Defeat Cardinals Tuesday, 61-36

Both Heppner and Ione High school basketball teams looked ragged in their game here Tuesday night but the Mustangs, built around three seasoned veterans, scored an easy victory over the sophomore-dominated Ione team, 61 to 36.

Three of the Cards' starters were sophomores from last year's crack freshman quintet while Heppner fielded a starting team composed of three seniors and two juniors.

Using their fast break, the Mustangs tallied two quick baskets at the start of the game and led all the way. Coach Gene Dockter's boys had trouble finding the hoop and could only score three field goals in the first half.

Coaches of both teams substituted freely throughout the game seeking to give all experience in this early season contest.

By the end of the first quarter Heppner had things well in command at 14-4 and advanced the margin to 38 to 14 by halftime. In the second half some of the Cardinal marksmen began to find the range and they tallied 24 points against 23 for Heppner. Third quarter's end, however, found Heppner pretty well out of reach at 53-28.

Mac Hoskins, Mustang center, was high point man for the game with 13 on three field goals and seven of 12 tries from the free throw line. Frank Halvorsen, up and coming sophomore of the Card quint, had 12 on three field goals and six of eight tries from the free throw line. Jim Doherty hit 12 for Heppner on five baskets and two gift tosses.

Violations and turnovers were team looked far from mid-season form. Forty-seven personals were called, 20 against Ione and 27 against Heppner.

Heppner's freshmen downed the Ione jayvees in the opener, 52 to 31.

Veterans of the Blue and Gold took right off where they finished last year with Jim Doherty burning the net with 22 points on nine field goals and four free throws while lefty Mac Hoskins collected 20 on seven buckets and six free throws.

Coming on strong from last year's jayvees to back up the veterans were Randy Stillman

who rang the bell with five field goals and Dave Hall who tallied six points on one field goal and four free throws.

Jim Jacobs, another veteran from the district and sub-district champions of the past two years, had a rather rough debut, both physically and in the foul department. He suffered a cut over an eye in the rough play and in the second half, went out of action on five personals.

Heppner shot in front quickly in the game, leading 12-3 by the end of the first quarter. Shifting into high in the second period they zoomed to a 34-14 halftime lead. By the end of the third quarter it was 50 to 27 for the Mustangs, and they coasted home, 66 to 44, as Coach Bob Clough used 10 of ready for action because of his 12-man squad, Russ Kilkenny, 6-3 junior forward, wasn't leg injury suffered in football. High point men for Pilot Rock were Ron Bond with 13 on three field goals and seven free throws, while Gene Harrison made 12 on four and four. In rebounding for Heppner, Hoskins picked off 11 while Doherty accounted for eight.
