Offices to Offer Federal Tax Aid

Filing period for 1966 Federal income tax returns will extend from January 3 through April 17, 1967, A. G. Erickson, district director of the Internal Revenue for Oregon, announces.

Eleven offices in the state will be open from 8 a.m. until 4:45 p.m. each Monday through April 17. Included are those at Pendleton (611 S. E. Emigrant) and The Dalles (Williams Building, 304 East Fourth Street).

An office at the Federal Building in La Grande will be open for assistance on two dates, February 9 and April 6, from 8 a.m. until 4:45 p.m.

The Portland office, 319 S. W. Pine Street, will provide information service Monday through Friday until April 17 during regular office hours.

"Taxpayers coming in for help will be asked to fill out as much of their returns as possible, and will be given any ad-

ditional information needed to complete them," Erickson said. He suggested taxpayers telephone for information before going to an Internal Revenue Service office, since essentially the same service is available by telephone as at the office.
