Win over Eagles Gives Mustangs Co-Championship

Heppner's Mustangs ran their basketball season league record to 9-3 Friday evening as they completely outmanned and outscored the visiting Wah-tonka Eagles, 87-55. The victory left the Mustangs co-champions with the Sherman High Huskies.

Dave Hall, junior guard, and Mac Hoskins, senior center, combined for 47 points, and Jim Doherty and Russell Kilkenny had 11 and 10 respectively for the home court Mustangs. Ken Nichols was the only double-figure scorer for the visitors as he pumped 14 counters through the hoops.

Heppner was never threatened as the team opened up a 10-0 lead and a 25-10 first period advantage. Things got worse instead of better for the visitors as the home town hoopers completely demolished the Eagles with a 30-14 second-quarter outburst. The Eagles went into the locker room with a 31 point deficit.

Sager, county treasurer, First National Bank, Heppner.

Goal of the campaign in the county is set at \$525. Mrs. Jepsen said. This sum was reached last year.

The paper Easter lilies, sold each year by the Society, will be placed on sale on the street in Heppner on March 18, the day before Easter, and will be sold in the self-addressed envelopes on the same day.
