

New Phone Books Churches Slate Being Delivered Here This Week

Delivery of some 1,500 copies of Pacific Northwest Bell's 1967 telephone directories with a new Call-Guide heading a list of innovations began Tuesday, March 14, in the Heppner area.

The Call-Guide constitutes a major change designed to make telephoning easier and replaces the old introductory section in the front of the book, according to Dale Slusher, local PNB manager.

Co-incident with the directory delivery start, Heppner area phone users will be introduced to a new phrase, "Directory Assistance," when calling the information operator. The new phrase provides a more accurate description of the service available from PNB directory assistance operators who assist callers in obtaining phone numbers.

The Call-Guide resulted from a recent study conducted by a research team from Oregon State University. The team, headed by Dr. Robert Graham, interviewed hundreds of phone users to determine the best way to make phone calling information, particularly in directories, more convenient. The new Call-Guide contains information on long distance calls and other customer instruction material.

Slusher pointed out that new ZIP code information is listed on page one of the yellow pages.

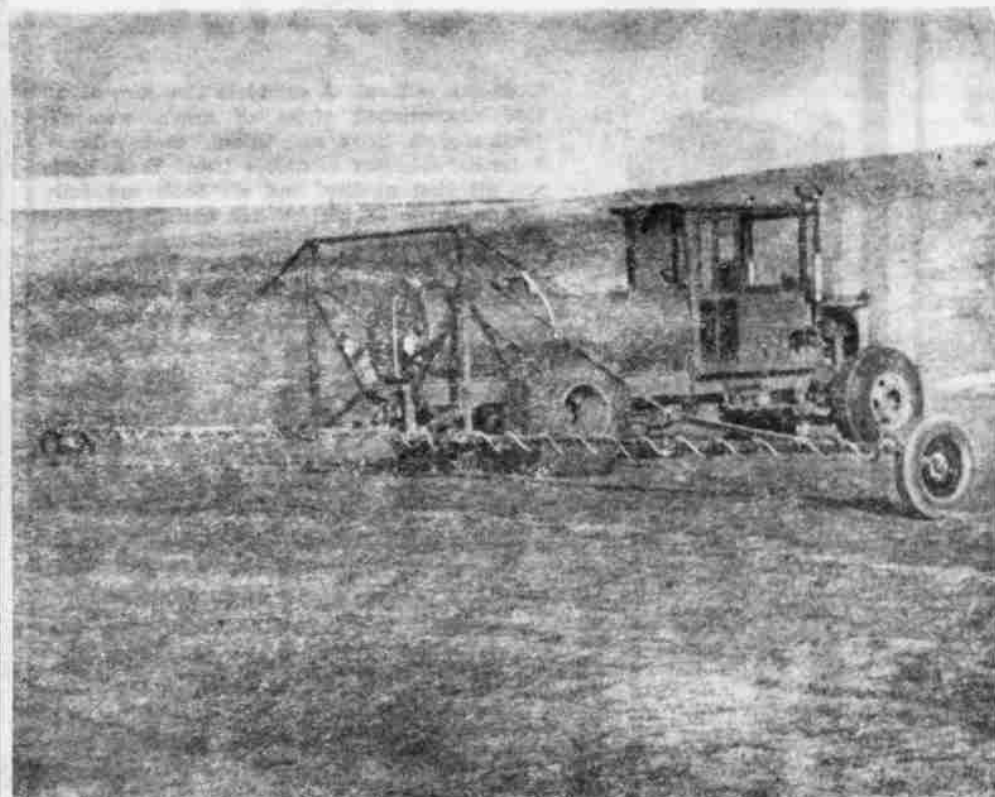

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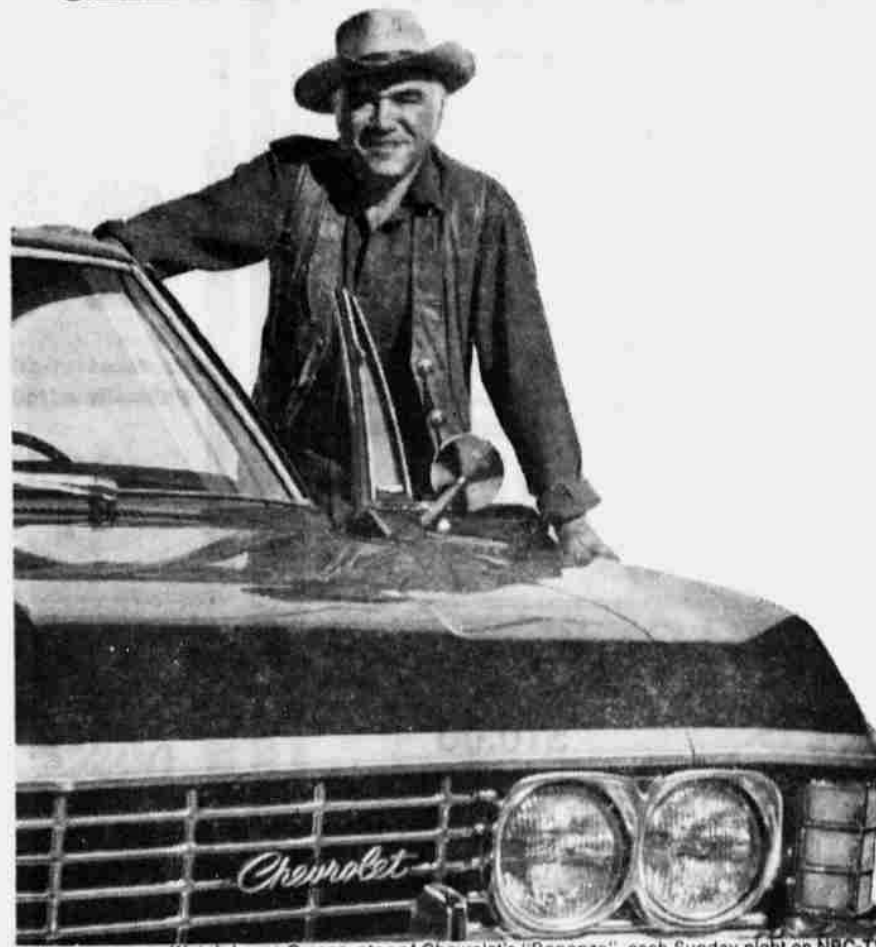
