Two Diamond-Type Interchanges Set

The Oregon State Highway Department has been advised by the Federal Highway Administration that it will approve two full diamond-type interchanges on the Stanfield Junction-Rieth Hill Section of Interstate 80N to service Rew Road and Yoakum and Ison Roads, it was announced today by Forrest Cooper, state highway engineer.

Originally, one diamond-type interchange had been planned at Yoakum Road and a separation at Rew Road. It was only after extended negotiations by the State Highway Department that the new interchange was approved. Residents of the area had requested the additional interchange.

Bids on the Stanfield Junction-Rieth Hill Section of Interstate 80N will be received on May 4 which will include the Yoakum Road interchange. Bids on the Rew Road interchange will be received at a later date but in sufficient time to have the work finished at the same time as the remainder of the freeway.

The Yoakum Road interchange is approximately nine miles west of the Umatilla River Crossing in Pendleton and Rew Road is one mile further west. Yoakum Road extends to the north while Ison Road runs in a southerly direction.
