Her wedding dress and stockings were modeled at the 60th wedding party by her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Claude Morgan. The dress was hand-made by Mrs. Clara Troedson Smouse, mother of Kenneth Smouse of Ione.

The Morgans resided in the Morgan vicinity until 1925, when they moved to Medical Lake, where they have been very active in civic and community affairs. Mr. Morgan is a past master of the Masonic Lodge there and received his 50-year pin several years ago. He joined the Masonic Lodge in Ione when he was 21 years old and his father, A. C. Morgan, was master.
