72 Seniors to Graduate from Three High Schools All Baccalaureate Services May 28

All three high schools in the county will hold baccalaureate services for their classes of 1967 on Sunday, May 28. At Heppner High and at Riverside High, Boardman, the services will be at 8 p.m. At Ione High school, the service will be at 3:00 p.m. All services will be in the respective school gymnasiums.

The Rev. Donald Pederson, pastor of Hope and Valby Lutheran churches will speak to Heppner High seniors and the audience; Father Raymond Beard, pastor of St. William's Catholic church, will speak at the Ione baccalaureate; and the Rev. George Neely, pastor of the Community Church, Boardman, will preach the sermon at the Riverside baccalaureate.

Teresa Tucker will sing a musical number, "The Lord's Prayer." Processional and recessional will be played by Gene Rietmann.

At the Riverside service, the Rev. Herbert Vaughn, pastor of the Community Baptist church, will deliver the invocation, and the Rev. John Kenny, pastor of the Assembly of God church, will pronounce the benediction. Robert Chilman will be soloist, and the Riverside High chorus will sing. Bibles will be presented during the service.

Seventy-two seniors in Morrow county's three high schools will graduate in commencement exercises on three consecutive nights next week.

Forty-four are on the class roster at Heppner High school where commencement will be in the gymnasium on Wednesday, May 31, at 8 p.m. Sixteen seniors are to graduate at Riverside High school, Boardman, on Thursday night, June 1, at 8 p.m. in the gymnasium. Twelve in the class of 1967 at Ione High school will receive diplomas there in exercises on Friday night, June 2, at 8 p.m. in the gymnasium.

Honor students at Heppner High include Miss Maralee Murray, valedictorian, and Miss Martha Peck, salutatorian. At Riverside, Michael Paul Partlow is valedictorian and Miss Shirley Ann Dixon and Miss Carol Anne Harper share honors as co-salutatorians. Twin sisters at Ione will give the valedictory and salutatory. They are Deniece Matthews, valedictorian, and Berniece Matthews, salutatorian.

Dr. Francis Nickerson, associate dean of students at the University of Oregon and an alumnus of Heppner High, will be the speaker at Heppner High commencement. He grew up in Heppner and graduated from high school before going to the University of Oregon. He has been with the State System of Higher Education for a number of years and was chosen associate dean of students a year or two ago.

Former Congressman Robert Duncan will be the speaker at Riverside High commencement. Formerly of Medford, Duncan is now living in Portland. He served the fourth congressional district of Oregon in Congress from 1963 until running for U. S. Senator last year.

Waldo Bowers of Corvallis, speaker at Ione High commencement, is assistant director of admissions at Oregon State University and an assistant professor there. He obtained his master of education degree from OSU in 1959.

Principal Richard Carpenter will present awards at Heppner High commencement, Ed Hiemstra will present the class, and Irvin Rauch, chairman of the school board, will present diplomas. 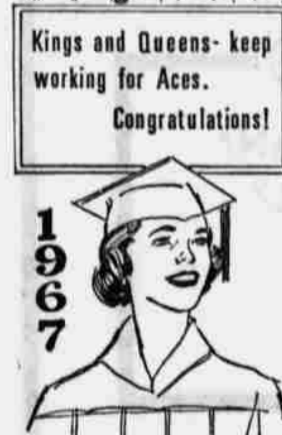
