Cheryl A. Morrison of Ione has won one of the top journalism awards for this year at Oregon State University, the OSU News Bureau states.

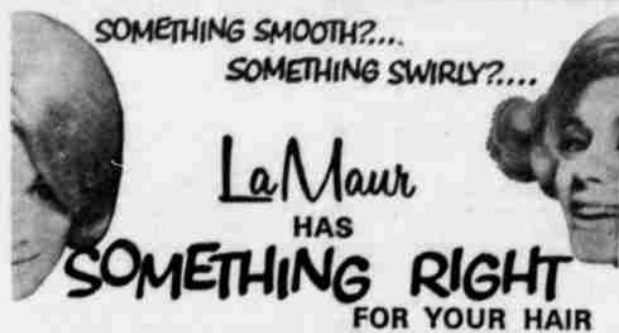
Miss Morrison was honored as the staff member on the student daily, the Barometer, who contributed most to general news and typographical excellence.

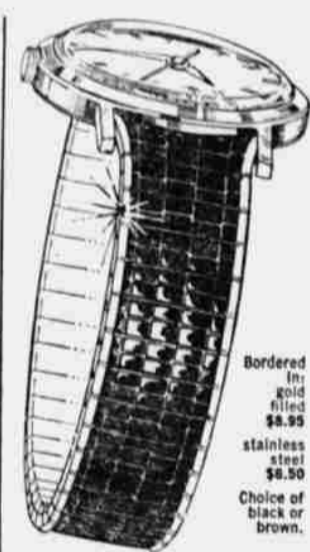
