Teachers Attend Marine Workshop At Camp Arago

Four of the Heppner Elementary teachers were among those who attended a workshop at Camp Arago, sponsored by Oregon Museum of Science and Industry, on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, May 26, 27 and 28. Attending were Mrs. Anita Stockard, Mrs. Jessie Faye Morris, Miss Susan Thompson and Mrs. Inez Erwin.

Camp Arago, in the Coos Bay area, specializes in Marine Biology, Oceanography and Geology. This area has the richest and most varied forms of sea life and marine fossils in the state. The tidal zones teem with strange plants and animals of varied colors and shapes. Workshop instructors proved to be experts in their fields.

About 35 teachers from all areas paid their own meals and lodging and transportation costs to obtain the instruction and observe on-the-beach marine plant and animal life in their natural habitat. The teachers were able to bring home alive many specimens for further study and laboratory work. Not only their own classes, but grades one through six, and one eighth grade class which had been studying oceanography were able to see first-hand the live plants and animals from the area.

Those attending the workshop felt it was one of the most educational and worthwhile ones which they had ever taken part in, and one from which the children gained much information.

The camp is organized with sessions for four levels throughout the summer: pre-teen, junior high, senior high, and family groups. O.M.S.I. is interested in obtaining scholarships for these field and laboratory programs.
