

Memorial Held at Lone Church For Ed Buschke, Pioneer Farmer

LONE — A pioneer wheat farmer of Morrow county, Edward Anton Buschke, 79, passed away at Pioneer Memorial hospital in Heppner on Thursday, July 20. He had been a patient there for two weeks following major surgery.

Recitation of the rosary was Sunday evening, July 23, at St. William's Catholic church in Lone with Requiem Mass on Monday morning. Reverend Raymond Beard was celebrant.

Vault interment was at High View Cemetery with graveside ritualistic services by Heppner Elks Lodge No. 358.

Casket bearers were Eddie Gunderson, Lewis Halvorsen, Darrell Padberg, Carl Troedson, Terrel Bengte, and Earl Morgan. Honorary bearers included L. E. Bisbee, Ed Bennett, Alva Jones, John Wightman, Ambrose Chapin, and Gerald Swaggart.

Mr. Buschke was born on August 26, 1887, at Salinas, Kansas, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Buschke. He had been a resident of the lone community since 1902. He was a wheat rancher in the Morgan area until his death.

Mrs. Buschke, the former Helen Mason, passed away in July of 1957.

He was a member of Heppner B.P.O.E. No. 358, Willows Grange at Lone and the lone I.O.O.F. Lodge.

Surviving him are two sons, Lewis of Lone and Henry of Whittier, Calif.; a daughter, Mrs. Roy (Josephine) Erner of Albany; three brothers, Claude of Heppner, Fred of Gresham; and Bill of Crescent Lake; five sisters, Ann Fehmerling of Seaview, Wash., Mary Travis of Westport, Wash., Martha Carr of Lincoln City, Grace Karl of Pendleton, and Millie Evans of Heppner; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
