County Horses Among Winners At Hermiston
 Results of the second annual Columbia Basin Quarter Horse Fall show have been released, and among the winners are several from Morrow county. The show was held Saturday, October 7, at the Umatilla county fairgrounds in Hermiston, and had a total of 230 entries.
 Among the area winners were Marcia Jones, Heppner, second in the stake race, with Ruby Fullerton taking fourth place, and her sister, Becky, coming in sixth.
 Among the barrel racing winners were Marianne Pettyjohn of Ione, second, and Marcia Jones, Heppner, fifth.
 In Class No. 10, for colts of 1967. First place was won by unnamed, out of Syke's Miss Dee by Plaudt Poco, owned by George Miller, Ione.
 In Class No. 14, competition for aged stallions, third place was won by Teddy Salute, out of Gill Co. Mare by Diamond Salute, owned by Virgil Chapman, Boardman.
 Texas Sue, out of Woodie Mare by Cuter 11, owned by Harry Noble of Boardman, took fourth in Class No. 17 for senior cutting competition, with Mr. Bar Barred, owned by Floyd Jones, coming in sixth.
 In the calf roping division, Dust Off, out of Lassie Parker by Red Tom, owned by Rolce Fullerton, Heppner, took fifth place. Dust Off also took third in the team roping and heading event, and fourth in the team roping and heeling competition.
 Barred's Lad, out of Bobby Lee by Barred, owned by Lee Pettyjohn, Ione, took first in the registered barrel racing event.
 Hollihan, out of Chubby Joy by Barbecue, owned by Rolce Fullerton, placed fifth in the pole bending competition.
 Director of youth events for the annual horse show was Floyd Jones, Heppner, who also serves as one of the directors of the Columbia Basin Quarter Horse Association.

Bowl Down Cancer Tourney Started
 More than 40,000 bowlers throughout Oregon are expected to participate in the seventh annual "Bowl Down Cancer" tournament which began qualifying rounds at bowling establishments in the state on October 15.
 The event is the largest kegling tourney in Oregon and is sponsored by the Oregon State Bowling Proprietors' association for the benefit of the American Cancer Society, Oregon Division, Inc. The 1967 renewal of "Bowl Down Cancer" will feature more than \$9,000 in prizes with a new Volkswagen automobile to go to the winning man and winning woman.
 Qualifying rounds will continue through October 29 with house eliminations scheduled to end November 12 and house finals to be completed by November 26. State finals will be held December 9-10 and December 16-17 at Kellogg Park Bowl in Milwaukie.
 There will be a total of 35 prizes in each of the men's and women's divisions. In addition to the Volkswagens, prizes will include tours to Hawaii, boats, color TV sets, a mink stole and golf and bowling equipment.
 All proceeds will go to the American Cancer Society. The past six tournaments have contributed more than \$140,000 to the fight against cancer. All bowlers may enter as many times as they wish by making a 50-cent contribution to the Cancer Fund. Those who beat their league average in the third game will be eligible to compete in the house eliminations where one of three entrants will advance to the house finals.
