**Problems Discussed At Council Meet**

**IRRIGON**—The business considered in the October session of the Irrigon City Council was opened by a stormy discussion regarding a request for alley vacation in Block 36. The request was presented by Mayor Wilson in behalf of Mr. Smallman who found it impossible to be present at the meeting. The request was denied in a roll call vote with Keith, Shade and McCoy favoring rejection and Henner abstaining. Councilman Stewart was absent.  
 The recorder reported no bids had been received for furnishing the city 900 yards of crushed rock other than from Schnell and Co. of Hermiston. The council voted to accept their bid to furnish the specified amount stockpiled at Irrigon.  
 A resignation tendered by Mrs. Houghton as recorder-treasurer was discussed at length. Because there are only two more months until the annual appointment for this office is considered, she agreed to continue until that time.  
 A report on current status of the city water revealed that half of the necessary 48 potential users had made application and paid the \$100 connection charge. It was emphasized again to the council that further steps such as issuing bonds, authorizing the engineers to proceed with design and actual construction of any phase of the proposed project are dependant upon securing 48 customers for service.  
 Mayor Wilson suggested that some time might be saved by leveling and shaping up the lots where the city well would be drilled before the contracts are awarded. This would give time for the ground to settle and stabilize. No action was taken to proceed.
