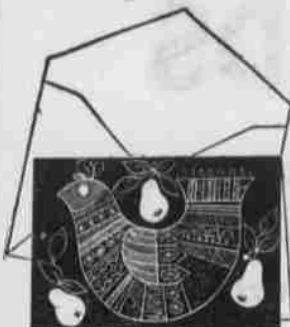
## Contract Given On Water Tank
