Mr. and Mrs. Bob Davidson were Portland callers one day last week, where she consulted a physician.

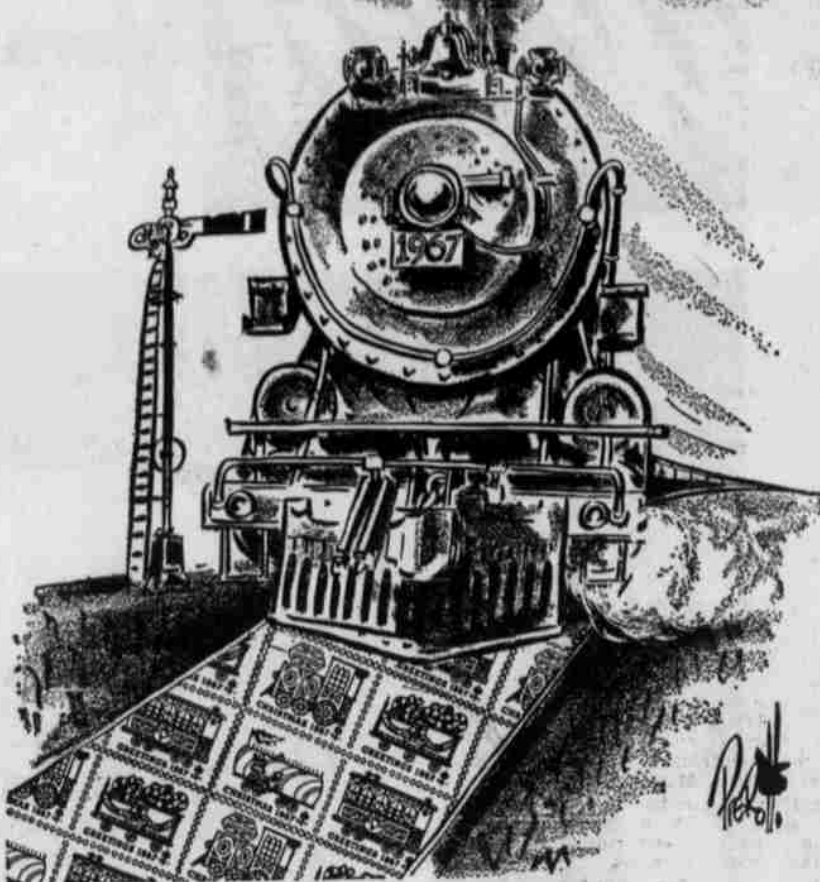
