The lands will be sold subject to a reservation to the United States of rights-of-way for ditches or canals under the Act of August 30, 1890 (26 Stat. 391; 43 U.S.C. sec. 945); subject to existing rights-of-way; and all minerals will be reserved to the United States.

No bid will be accepted for less than the appraised value to which bid must be added the cost of publication of \$30.00 for each parcel.

Sealed or oral bids may be made by the principal or his agent. Bids for a parcel must be for all the lands in a parcel. Sealed bids will be considered only if received at the Land Office, 729 N. E. Oregon Street (P. O. Box 2965), Portland, Oregon 97208 prior to the time of the sale on each date the auction is held. Sealed bids must be in envelopes accompanied by certified checks, post office money orders, bank drafts, or cashier's checks made payable to the Bureau of Land Management for the amount of the bid plus publication costs of \$30.00. The envelopes must be marked in the lower left hand corner "Public Sale Bid OR 2600, Tract No.". Personal checks will be accepted from successful oral bidders. The successful oral bidder at the sale will be required to pay immediately the amount thereof together with the cost of publication. The right is reserved to determine at any time that the lands should not be sold or that any and all bids should be rejected.
