About 100 guests enjoyed an afternoon of Christmas caroling, movies, and a visit from Santa, who treated each child present with a sack of candy and an orange.

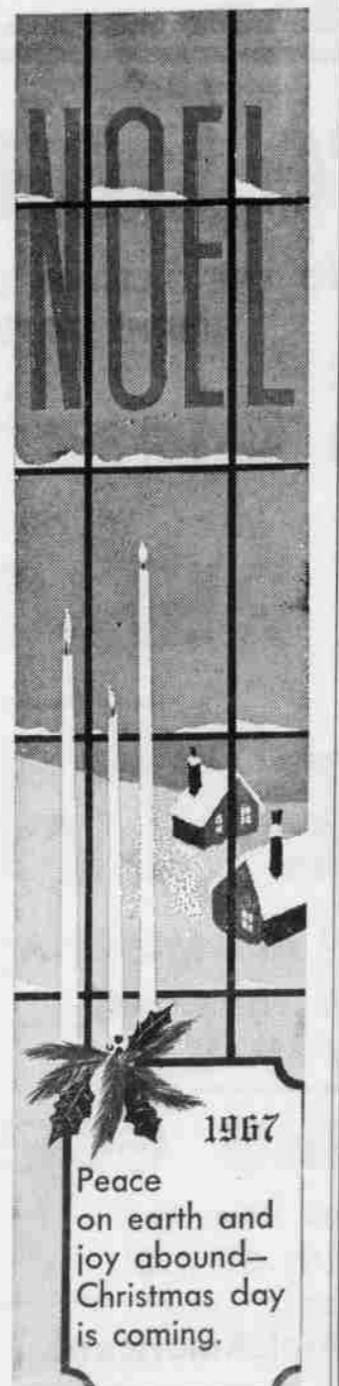
**Schools Staffs Join

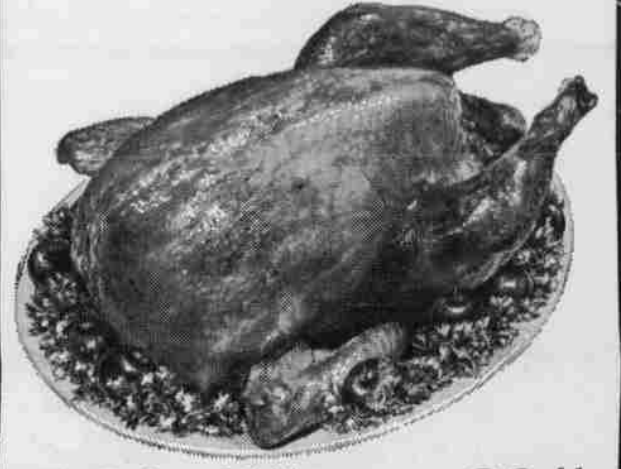
